

AJJC 2022 Annual ICJ Update

Follow Up from 2021/2022

UNITY (Uniform Nationwide Interstate Tracking for Youth) platform launched. 2023 will bring in enhancements to the system.

15 proposed rule changes were voted on in 2021 at the ABM. 14 Rule changes passed and went into effect March 1st 2022.

DCA Wykes appointed full time Designee in Jan 2022

DCA Wykes selected as Western Region Representative at the 2022 ABM.

35% Dues increase passed at 2022 ABM



Supervised Youth

Incoming

In FY 2021, we had 76 youth come to AZ under the ICJ Compact

In FY 2022, we had 103 youth come to AZ under the ICJ Compact

Outgoing

In FY 2021, we had 63 youth leave AZ under the ICJ Compact

In FY 2022, we had 54 youth leave AZ under the ICJ Compact



Current Snapshot

As of 11/7/22, AZ ICJ is supervising 86 incoming youth from other states and we currently have 43 AZ youth being supervised in other states.

Returns

In FY 2020, Arizona ICJ returned 25 AZ youth from other states that were either runaways and or absconders.

FY 2021, we lost access to part of the data during the platform switch but know we returned at least 11 AZ youth.

In FY 2022, Arizona ICJ returned 65 AZ youth from other states that were either runaways and or absconders. We were involved in a total of 131 returns in FY 2022.
