Arizona Governor’s Commission on Service and Volunteerism

- Fellow Commissioners, Tori Carlson, formerly with Interfaith Community Services (a Service Enterprise) and Donna Martin, Boys and Girls Clubs of the Valley (a Service Enterprise) as well as Susan Nusall, Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education (a Service Enterprise), and Sandra Freyer, Service Enterprise Program Manager at the Center are focusing on increasing awareness of and educating nonprofits, schools, and municipalities about the initiative.
 - A virtual discussion with City of Fort Collins (accredited) took place on April 17th – it was recorded and is providing good materials for social media and other communication tools.
 - Dr. Ashcraft attended Aster Aging, Inc.’s Volunteer Appreciation Event and presented the Certificate of Accreditation to the organization as part of the program.
 - Interviews with the CEOs of Interfaith Community Services and Catholic Charities Community Services are scheduled for May.
 - The Association of Leaders in Volunteer Engagement (ALIVE) annual Hub survey has been submitted and included Tori, Donna, and Susan’s feedback and suggestions. We will share outcomes once received.
